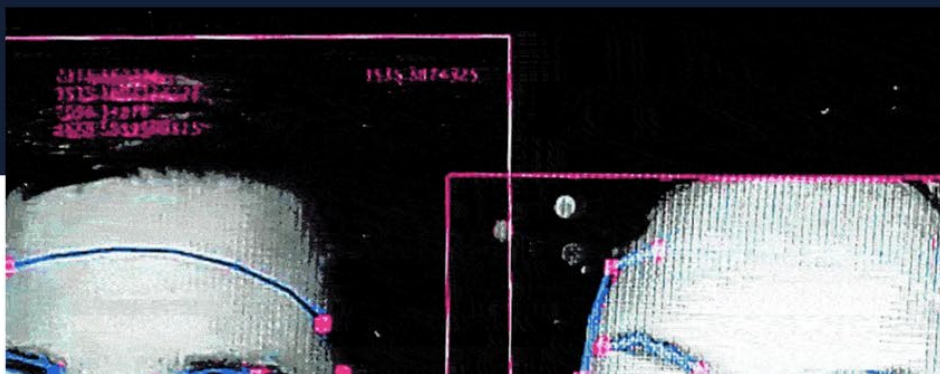

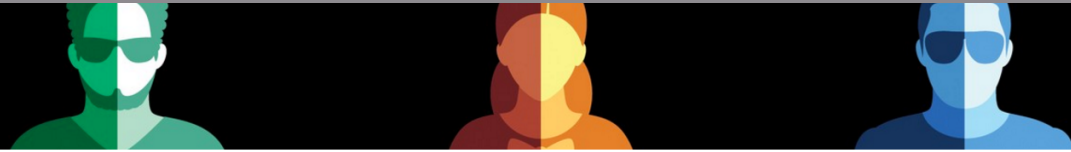

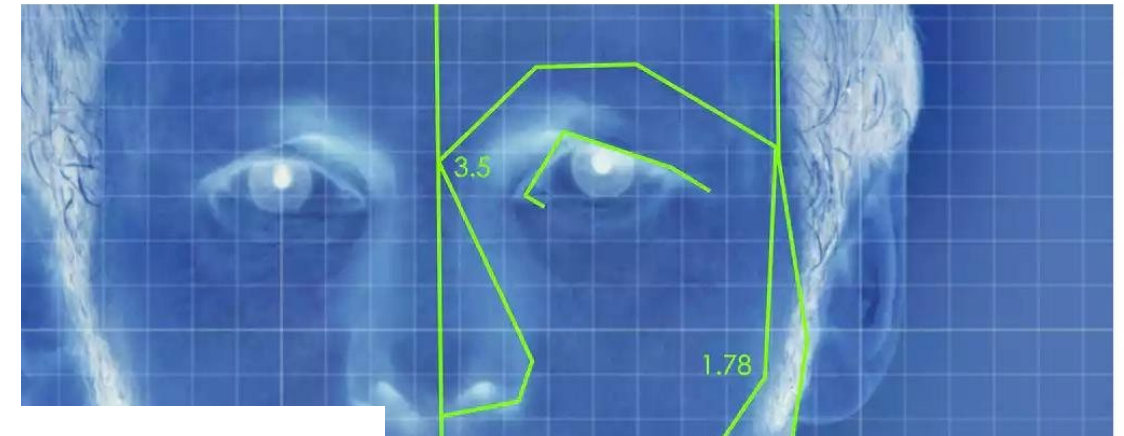

Private traits and attributes are predictable from digital records of human behavior

On the other hand, the predictability of individual attributes from digital records of behavior may have **considerable negative implications**, because it can easily be applied to large numbers of people without obtaining their individual consent and without them noticing. Commercial companies, governmental institutions, or even one's Facebook friends could use software to infer attributes such as intelligence, sexual orientation, or political views that an individual may not have intended to share. One can imagine situations in which such predictions, even if incorrect, could pose a threat to an individual's well-being, freedom, or even life. Importantly, given the ever-increasing amount of digital traces people leave behind, it becomes difficult for individuals to control which of their attributes are being revealed. For example, merely avoiding explicitly homosexual content may be insufficient to prevent others from discovering one's sexual orientation.

The Court of Chancery granted *defendants'* motion to dismiss based on lack of subject matter jurisdiction. The court held that Elf's claims arose under the Agreement, or the transactions contemplated by the agreement, and were directly related to Jaffari's actions as manager of Malek LLC. Therefore, the court found that the Agreement governed the question of jurisdiction and that only a court of law or arbitrator in California is empowered to decide these claims. Elf now appeals the order of the Court of Chancery dismissing the complaint.

Reducing Bias and Improving Safety in DALL·E 2

Today, we are implementing a new technique so that DALL·E generates images of people that more accurately reflect the diversity of the world's population. This technique is applied at the system level when DALL·E is given a prompt describing a person that does not specify race or gender, like “firefighter.”

Based on our internal evaluation, users were $12\times$ more likely to say that DALL·E images included people of diverse backgrounds after the technique was applied. We plan to improve this technique over time as we gather more data and feedback.

ABSTRACT

The television anthology series *Black Mirror* uses speculative fiction about technology to comment on contemporary social issues, often exploring the ethics of current technologies. Based on the structure of that show, the "Black Mirror Writers Room" is a teaching exercise designed to help students creatively speculate about future harms and consequences of current technologies, and has been used by dozens of instructors in classes related to computing ethics and society, as well as technical computing classes. We interviewed 12 instructors in the university setting who have used this or similar exercises in their classrooms about their experiences and student reactions. We describe benefits and challenges of using creative speculation in the classroom (and beyond) for exploring ethics, justice, and related issues in computing.

Researchers use methods from design fiction to encourage reflection about potential downsides or to illustrate forward-thinking ethical considerations [25, 28, 29]. Looking towards the future in this way is also a useful tool in the classroom. For example, a "Science Fiction and Computer Ethics" course encourages students to cultivate their "moral imagination" through analyzing science fiction stories; a key insight was that "a good technology ethics course teaches students how to think, not what to think, about their role in the development and deployment of technology" [7]. The "SIGCSE Reads" initiative also encouraged use of science fiction in CS classes [1]. Examples of using creative speculation in the classroom include an activity where students write "design fictions" to investigate the ethical implications of future technologies [2], and the use of "science fiction prototyping" in a computer security class [20].
